VICTORY ROUNDABOUT UPDATE

Report from PAM MANSFIELD

On 6th October the BCA held an open meeting about Victory Roundabout, incorporating the fortnightly coffee morning, and put on a display of informative material, incorporating the local residents' feelings on the subject. The petition signed by 69 residents gathered by Mary Bartle and the results of the questionnaire were also included in the display. There were 88 replies giving a 12.8% response from the area. 79% wished for the subways to remain and 59% favoured subways and pedestrian crossings.

About 30 residents attended and asked many questions, all comments were noted.

On 20thOctober the council held an open meeting at the Village Hall with an independent chairman, Mr MNT Cottell OBE,FREng, FICE. A technical panel of experts gave information and answered questions put through the chair. The council then explained their 'preferred option'. Local people, giving the technical panel more to reconsider, raised many issues.

One important factor did emerge, in 1996/97 the consultants helping to prepare plans for the reduction of Victory Roundabout were asked to consider hard surface water. Ground water was not included. They stated that they were not aware of the flooding!

We will continue to press for answers to your questions on the council's 'preferred option'. We have been promised answers and await Mr Cottell's report. WATCH this SPACE.

'It has come to our notice that there is some concern locally with regard to block paving which has been laid within this Conservation Area. This has been carried out under permitted developments rights and does not require planning permission. However, Basingstoke and Deane do have money available under the Conservation Enhancement Fund, which could be utilised to provide improvements, including traditional paving, to the area. Proposal to erect 484 Flats at Down West Yard (Scats Yard)-Residents in East Brookvale have received a letter from the Council with regards to this development - the date for objections being October 25th 2001. The BCA have sent a letter to the Planning and Transport Department initially objecting on the grounds of a high-density development and the generation of high volumes of traffic and the intrusion of the height of some buildings on the skyline.


