Those who didn't come missed a grand afternoon. We went home happy in the knowledge that Brookvale is up and coming with lots of new families. Keep up the good work and thank you.





Thanks to Councillor Biermann, Victory Roundabout was included in the agenda of the Environment Overview & Scrutiny Committee (OSCOM) meeting on 8th November 2001. It was agreed to put forward the motion of setting up a Victory Roundabout Scrutiny Panel. It will consist of 3 councillors and 2 members of the public. This was agreed at Cabinet on 6th December 2001 and Pam Mansfield has been appointed as one of the members of public to be on the panel. The first meeting is on 31st January 2002 at the Village Hall. Local residents are welcome to attend. We will keep you posted.
