Message from our Community Beat Officer

I would like to introduce myself as Kat Boyd and I am the community beat officer for an area in Basingstoke which includes Brookvale.

Since 1st March 2003 the crime reported in the area of Brookvale shows there have been two vehicles stolen, five thefts from motor vehicles, a bicycle stolen from a back garden, damage caused to a window and four burglaries. In comparison with other areas this is a very small amount of crime, however I urge people to be extra vigilant. Please ensure that no valuables are left in your vehicles and please ensure that windows and doors are left secure at your houses or premises.

Recently the green area in Lower Brook Street has been subjected to an arson attack resulting in the adjoining premises being seriously damaged by fire. Any witnesses or information regarding this incident are sought. please contact myself at the Police Station. It has been mentioned that local youths use this area regularly and I would urge parents to know where your children are and what they are up to. The Community Beat Office is looking at existing ways and developing new ways to deal with anti-social behaviour and where offences are committed the offending persons will be dealt with robustly.

From meeting various residents over the last few months I see you live in a strong community and Police rely on your help in trying to reduce crime in your area. The telephone number for reporting all non-urgent crime is 0845 0454545. If you do hear something about a crime or see anything but you don't want to get involved there is something you can do without risk. You can contact CRIMESTOPPERS on 0800 555 111, and provide information anonymously. Thank you.




