Our campaign to save Brookvale's Post Office was not successful. We are very sad to report that Queens Road Post Office closed on 1st February 2005. It had been serving the Brookvale community since 1910 (source: Royal Mail Heritage).

All those that were involved in the campaign are very angry at the Royal Mail for closing this important local amenity. Brookvale Community Association would like to thank all the residents and local businesses that signed the petition and wrote in with their views. The local Liberal Democrats party also campaigned heavily on this issue and we are very grateful to Cllr John Shaw, Jen Smith and their door-to-door team for their time and efforts in getting so many signatures.

We would also like to thank Mr Bopari, our Sub Post Master, for the many years he has spent serving our community.

Free eye tests available

A free home-based eye care and testing service is available to people who qualify. Those who cannot visit an optician unassisted, regardless of age are entitled to the eye care service. This includes people who need the assistance of friends or relatives to get out and about or people who have difficulty using public transport. You are entitled to a sight test if you have eye problems, are over 70 and have not had a sight test for two years or have been advised to have more frequent eye examinations and one is now due.

An optometrist will examine your eyes in your own home. They are equipped to detect glaucoma, cataracts and other potential visual problems and can provide advice and assistance in choosing the best frames and lenses.

New Road proposals

Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council have developed a Central Area Action Plan which lays out all the plans to raise the quality, image and vitality of our town centre.

A draft Concept Statement has now been prepared for the upper section of New Road (the road behind McDonalds and the main Post Office at the Top of Town). The ideas include providing new homes and buildings to create a "more traditional street whilst maintaining New Road's role as an important route within the Top of Town".

The Borough Council has begun a consultation period which will last until 30th April 2005 and welcomes your views on the ideas for New Road. This is your opportunity to have your say on the regeneration of our town centre.

The Price of Ignorance!

Last month was the first time a copy of Blurb came through my letter box at Victory Hill. To be honest, I wasn't even aware that we were part of Brookvale. It was a nice change to receive a piece of mail that was not offering me another credit card or a menu for another new pizza delivery service, so I read it. Yes, I actually read it and I even logged on to the web site, curious about who was behind this newsletter. I guess my curiosity was fuelled by its apparent uniqueness – I have not seen this type of voluntary community awareness within an urban environment before and so I offered my sponsorship as a local business because I believe I can offer something to my neighbours too and this feels like a good way of sharing knowledge and experiences.

Early last year, my Grandmother died at the age of 89, succeeding my Grandfather by some 10 years. It was a sad time for our family as it marked the passing of a generation. We all mourned her in our own ways and my mother, the eldest of three children, had the added responsibility of closing her mother's affairs.

Now I chose to write this piece and title it "The Price of Ignorance!", because not one of us realised what we were getting into and how ignorance cost our family a serious amount of money. If you're like me, you don't think a great deal about what will happen when you're gone and I can now say, with experience, that this is an expensive mistake.

Here is an astonishing fact: the Law Society says that 70% of us don't have a will and trust the laws of intestacy to settle our affairs. Do you know what effect that has on your estate?

However, both of my Grandparents had wills. But then I learnt that there are good wills and not so good wills. They had the latter. It cost us thousands to the taxman that could have been saved so easily. So I ask this question in hindsight - do the 30% that do have wills have an appropriate one?

The whole probate process took over 18 months to sort out and saw the Inland Revenue getting a large chunk of money that could have been kept by our family. I wonder whether either of my Grandparents would have wanted it to end this way?!

So, why am I sharing this story with you? Because I can make a difference and if the circulation of Blurb is 1000, statistically 700 of my neighbours don't have a will! That's 700 families who are leaving their hard earned assets to the mercy of the state! To die 'intestate' (without having made a will) can produce untold problems for those left behind. But it doesn't end with a will, how many

of you reading this know the consequences of becoming incapable to handle your own affairs? Who will act on your behalf and do they have the legal authority to do so? What are your options if you are struck down and can't live without artificial means of life support? It's in our nature to avoid doing necessary things if we perceive them to be uncomfortable, but imagine how uncomfortable it will be if you do nothing.

These are not pleasant thoughts but they are facts of life. Making a will and providing proper legal authority gives you a feeling that you have done everything correctly and provides a sense of security that only comes in the knowledge that you have tied up all those loose ends.
