Success of Impromptu Sports Fun Day report from Pam Banks

Inspired by a magazine article giving ideas of amusing children during the long summer holidays, Tina Murphy, of George Street, thought she'd try organizing a children's Sports Day. Tina, who has two daughters attending Kings Furlong Junior School, contacted her friend Fiona Fraser, who also has a young family, asking if she would like to help.

They hoped that children in the area would like to join in the fun. Ruth Buckingham arranged for a BCA leaflet drop through local doors letting families know of the forthcoming activity. Tina said there wasn't really a lot to actually organize. The equipment needed was easily found - skipping ropes, spoons, potatoes and sacks. Pam Mansfield gave some red and white tape to mark out the tracks. Tina spent a few evenings before hand making rosettes to be awarded for 1st and 2nd placings.

On the day around 50+ children arrived on the King

George Playing Field all ready to join in the fun. The ages ranged from toddlers to 14 year olds. There were 3 legged, sack, skipping, running and wheelbarrow races. These were organized into four sections - toddlers, infants, juniors and seniors. The children received rosettes and sweets for taking part and when not in the races they enjoyed playing in the park. Orange and blackcurrant squash drinks were available from the refreshment table.

"It was lovely", said Tina. "All the children joined together and enjoyed themselves. Mums, Dads, Grandparents, friends and visitors came along to watch and cheer the children on. A lot of people said "Thank you". I met quite a few people from the area that I didn't know. It took little organization and the BCA helped with the leaflets".

Chantelle to sing at the Royal Albert Hall



Planning News

Tony Curtis, Director of Planning & Transportation, will be meeting the Management Committee on November 1st to discuss Victory Roundabout. An update will follow in the December Issue.

Parking restrictions will be finalised on October 24th. This will curtail parking on Lower Brook Street (rear of BCOT) to between 6-8 cars, with a time limit of 4 hours

For those who may not have noticed, planning permission has been submitted to demolish 47 Queens Rd (the old Off Licence/Flower Shop) to build three new houses. Objections/support (Planning ref: BDB/48636) to be in to the council by November 7th.

Arrangements are now well under way. The hall will be opened by Arthur Attwood at 2pm with Father Christmas in attendance. The Children's party will then run from 2.15pm to 4pm. There will not be enough adults to give adequate supervision to the young children them so, for their own safety, we must ask that parents stay with their offspring.

We are also arranging an 'interlude' of Adult entertainment during this time - Arthur Lester with accordion accompaniment will be performing for the pleasure of our

adult residents from 5pm - 6.30pm. Mulled wine and mince pies will also be served.

The magnificent Fireworks Display starts at 7.00pm. After which you can join Brando for one hour's Salsa tuition followed by freestyle for two hours between 8.30 and 11.30pm. Please note we cannot provide a bar so make sure you remember to bring your own tipple and nibbles!




