Obituary

Loveday Jones 1909 - 2009

In this issue we note the passing of Brookvale's oldest resident.

Loveday was born and lived in 44 George Street until April 2009, and would have been 100 in June.

Loveday was one of the first pupils to attend Brook Street School (Lower Brook Street School) in 1914 leaving in June 1923.

Her mother was Cornish, hence her name, and had many holidays in Cornwall on her Uncle's farm.

Loveday started work at Burbery in 1923, moving to Eli Lilly as a supervisor until she retired in 1969.

Loveday supported the BCA in her own quiet way, and attended St Michael's Church. Up until her stroke she was still knitting for charity.
