
A Eulogy By Tom Gilvear:

I've heard a number of stories of his time there, and I'm sure it was a fun time judging by some of the antics that went on in this verv strict Militarv Establishment. The odd 'test flight' to the North of England to collect some local delicacv (namely Black Pudding) to eat back in the Mess Room..
