
A Eulogy By Tom Gilvear:

#### **Planting News**

Along the wall by Moose Hall in Glebe Gardens we planted the following:

Privet x5, Hawthorn x4. Cotoneaster x2, Dogwood, Blackthorn, Hazel, Gelder Rose x4, Ivy, Pomegranate, Hebe, Fern, Holly, Lilac, Clematis and a Dog Rose.

At the foot of the Loddon facing the substation, we planted a meadow, comprising:

Cowslip, Teasel, Greater & Common Knapweed, Field Scabious, Foxglove and Wild Basil.

You will notice a number of exposed square (30cmx30cm) patches of soil where the seed In order for the was sown. meadow to grow successfully, the turf and top soil was removed to prevent the new meadow plants from being overwhelmed by the growth of established grass and weeds.

We hope that the trees and wildflower seed planted will increase our local insect, bird and bat population. Also. endeavoured to protect our local wildlife from the danger of discarded rubbish by undertaking a litter pick.
