Prof. Morris Entertainer 1950-2010 NORMAN DAVID MORRIS B.A. (Hons.) continued...




Cleggie My Mate Norm. A Eulogy By

Norman decided to become a full time Professor of

Punch and Judy In 2005, he left the security of paid employment at Lansing Linde, and further enhanced his repertoire by visiting schools around the South and providing the History of the Victorian Seaside Theme, which became part of the School Curriculum, Norman enjoyed every minute of his life as Mr Punch's handyman, with the emphasise on Normans hands.

Norman was also a Member of the Magicians in Basingstoke and often seen carrying out 'table magic' at formal Dinners, along with entertaining children with balloon modelling, and kids magic. Many will remember, with great affection, Derek the Performing Duck.

As if life wasn't busy enough Norman became a Member of the Oaklev Lodge of Freemason's in 1986, attaining the position of Master in 1996, he was also a Member of side degrees including Mark, and Chapter, taking an active role within, his skill of retaining ritual was no doubt assisted by his theatrical background. # **New Interpretation Board**

## History to present day!

When BCOT install our new Interpretation Board in Victory Park, you will see one of the panels which shows a theme of:

# Early History

Brookvale has lona а historv of settlement. nails, Roman paving. pottery, were found bv Victory Park. The site is now under Churchill Wav. Finds of a spearhead and a knife indicate Saxon settlement. Records show a tan yard, pits, houses, mill and mill houses in North Brook Street (Brook Street) in 1663.

Much of the land was owned by the Duke of Bolton, Winchester College and Magdalen College.

There was a workhouse on Frog Lane (Lower Brook Street) and field names of Long Croft and Sheepwash Meadow show rural life. Flaxpool is a link to linseed and linen production, and osiers were grown here, to make fencing. A map of 1762 shows that all the land use was agricultural, from Deep Lane Barn in the west to Basingstoke Parsonage (Chute House) in the east.

Land holdings were dramatically changed by the Enclosure Act of 1788, and have continued to change ever since.
