



Victory Update

In December some of the worst flooding on the roundabout occurred. Following a conversation with Lynden Jones, Roger Arthur-Reeves attended the December Management Committee meeting to let us know the Council's current plans on this area.

The Council do have someone

checking the roundabout twice a day for flooding. They have had two separate companies survey the area and correction plans will be ready to be submitted to the 'New Cabinet' in January. Hopefully a decision will then be made.

Exactly when the problem will be tackled is not known. The biggest problem is that all the service companies have their equipment running under the roundabout. Simply it would appear that the substrata in that area forms a mini lake. The natural water level is only one metre below ground level, and the drainage system is only for surface water; this results in constant flooding of the subways (as if we didn't know!).

The tributary of the River Lodden now actually runs from Essex Road under Victory Roundabout towards Alencon Link then turns east.

The pumps at the roundabout are only 2-inch. To clear the flooding in December they added 4-inch pumps then 6-inch once they could be obtained. These had not been immediately available due to the national flooding problem.

The water runs into an old land drainage system created in 1904 which later facilitated a foul drainage system for the town. From here the 6-inch pipes pump it into the River Lodden (at a higher level) to Eastrop Park. Since then the pump at the Essex Road subway has been changed to a 3-inch. The Council were prepared to reinstall the pedestrian crossing if it had continued any longer.

Many of you will remember a meeting in the Village Hall in 1998 with Laing Construction and Grosvenor Properties, the Management Committee also held a further meeting. We all stressed the problems of the area, pointing out its history. It was not called Noah's Island for nothing. They assured us that it was all under control!!!

In effect we were totally ignored. We await the 'solution', but don't hold your breath!

Brookvale Lottery

The BCA runs a weekly lottery. The whole purpose of the lottery is to build a fund for maintaining the Village Hall. Over the years it has been running, we have gradually lost Agents and residents wanting to join the lottery. The fund remained static, but we have recently had to draw on these funds to help pay for the rebuild of the hall and they are now somewhat depleted.

While the hall is now 100%, in a couple of years it will start to need minor repairs and re-decorating. So a drive is now on to refill the coffers. The lottery draw really is quite simple and easy to join. The balls are drawn on a weekly basis by Gill Lucas, the lottery promoter. The lottery is only open to members (a legal requirement) which means you have to pay 10 pence to join for a year. Each draw then costs a further 10 pence. There's a weekly prize of £10 up for grabs.

We are also asking for Agents. It is not difficult, and only takes a few hours every two to three months. There is full back-up and support.

Electric, Gas and Water being the main draws.



We now have our Hall fully operational, so funds have to be found to run it. Back in June 2000 there was a call for the Brookvale Community Association to continue.
