The workshops were set up as a contract that Spectrum are running on behalf of HCC. The money set aside for this project is purely to help new and existing ULOs to aet further established. This funding is part of central government's aim to get users to run and be in control of their own services.

After the workshop Ian Loynes (Spectrum's Chief Executive and overall head). had been looking at the Parability sites and information and they really like what we are doing in meeting many of the county's aims for this project and will work with us as our mentor.

Saunders Field

There is a lovely walk from Wickes to the Fire Station that is part of the Loddon Green Route/Flood Plain and the cycle-route to town. It passes a field over grazed by horses, and Saunders Field, a neglected site packed full of over 150 identified plant species that provide food for butterflies, bees and These water-meadows are more. national priority habitats but have been included in the project to lease out the Leisure Park to get bigger and better restaurants and amusements. It would be a shame if these water-meadows are lost to car-parking or worse, when there could be such a great opportunity to retain wildlife and for residents to have access to natural green space.

Our communities were not consulted about the Leisure Park Regeneration. The Borough started this process in November 2012 to incorporate Saunders Field into the Leisure Park Regeneration. Montagu Evans were chosen to increase units within the Leisure Park by moving car parking, black water collection and sewerage digestion into Saunders Field (to increase the density of the units in the Leisure Park). This action threatens to remove our last opportunity to retain natural green space and its wildlife in our communities (as recommended by Natural England), and a place where schools and all ages could experience and learn about nature and where Brookvale and South Ham residents get access to a green lung for recreation with biodiversity:
