
Position Filled

What is a Beetle Drive?

Each player has an individual card with 9 boxes per side to record the game. A dice is used to throw for different parts of the beetle. These must be collected in sequence. Therefore you must have the head before you can add the eyes, feelers, body, legs or tail. Each body part is equal to a certain number on the dice. The head = 6, the body = 5, the tail = 4, etc. etc. The first person to complete their beetle shouts "Beetle" and the game stops. Everyone adds up their score of whatever parts they managed to get. The person on the table with the highest score moves on to the next table. This continues till all games are completed and scores added up. Then the winner of the drive is declared. A beetle drive is GREAT FUN FOR ALL AGES.
