# **.Bygones**

The Basingstoke & Alton Light Railway ran from the main railway, across what is now King George V playing field, past the Thornvcroft factory, to Alton. It had a short life but is in many ways one of the most famous railways in Britain, since it was the line in both films The Wreckers (1928) and Oh! Mr. Porter (1937) and was the first line to be built under the Light Railways Act of 1896, and was opened on 1 June 1901. Here is their 1st Journey:



Initially, there were three passenger trains each way daily, this being increased to six in 1909. Nevertheless the line was far from profitable, so it was closed and the lines taken up for the war effort in 1917, to be re-laid in France. In 1924 the track was re-laid here and the line reopened, but it finally closed passengers in 1932, and for goods in 1936, after which most of the track was once more taken up. A last piece of track is inside the Viables Roundabout.

# Friends Of Loddon Vale Parks



As the temperatures rise, snowdrops were followed by crocuses and daffodils, until now when we have bluebells and anemones.

Anemone Blanda is a compact rhizomatous perennial to 15cm, with dark green leaves composed of three lobed and toothed segments.



These were planted last year by the Friends in the Autumn/Spring bulb plantings per the Council agreed plan.

This low growing plant reduces evaporation, increases biodiversity & provides bee pollen.

The Friends planted a Lavender hedge. Our bee and butterfly border is starting to get established.

The Cardoons should produce nice flower heads this year which the bees will adore!

# **Development SubCtte**

Alexander Road yard development 16/00441/FUL (consultation ended 24th March 2016). Again, this application overlooks the residents, and due to the number of objections, will go to B&DBC DCC. meeting Please forward any last minute objections to us.

Mike Westbrook and the residents are escalating the Worting Road dangerous surface on to the county road team for urgent repair.

As predicted, the Local Plan was passed with the original headline of 850 housing per year but this time around included focus on infrastructure requirements and a direction to engage and work with the community groups to hopefully develop meaningful targets and vision for infrastructure.

However, this higher number of units (responses requested lower units) is not sustainable and does not suggest any land on the outskirts of town, suitable for a new football club stadium. The Old Common appears safe for the meantime and volunteers are asked to apply to their ward councillor become one of the Friends of the Common and one of the Friends of Saunders Field.

The Leisure Park regeneration partner New River Retail was approved in spite of objections that funding this development with new retail on the park (not via a partner consortium), will cause more shop closures in the Town Centre. The Thornycroft Roundabout work will await the outcome of 3000 more parking spaces increasing congestion and queuing emissions.

In line with the Planning Inspector's requirement that the Council should work with the Community, Natural Basingstoke developed and provided a Vision document for Saunder's Field to the Council's Lead Officer.

### FREE HOME ENERGY SURVEY

BCA, Basingstoke Transition and Basingstoke Energy Co-operative carried out free energy surveys of homes in Brookvale and elsewhere this winter. We could not get to everyone as we were hampered by continual changing weather temperatures (how do you plan for a prolonged cold spell to carryout the surveys?) and by volunteer availability. Our thanks to the Council for the loan of their special camera for this work.

We visited one really challenging property, an ex 1960's Council House where the proud owner (with a young family) was doing his best to double glaze without anyone informing him that there was actually a hole from the inside wall to the outside wall where one could plainly see daylight and this was where all his heat was escaping! This together with the upstairs of these housing estate properties having only a single skinned wall, makes them difficult & expensive to heat, especially if still using the originally fitted electric blower system.
