Bygones

Jane Austen

An 18th-century author (in the days when men were usually published), created her best known works while living in this area, including her famous book Pride & Prejudice (expressed both in performance & film!).

She was born in Steventon in 1775, lived in Chawton and "retired" to Winchester 1817.

This year to celebrate Jane Austen 200, a new exhibition showcasing 80 of her historic artifacts will be held in the Winchester Discovery Centre Gallery from 13 May to 24 July: followed by a talk by Debbie Reavell on June 15th at 7.30 pm in the **Basingstoke** Willis Museum Archaeology Gallery, book in advance, 01256 465902 (daytime); then finally, Jane's life in society exhibition at the Willis Museum Basingstoke, from 29th July to 7th October.

Today, look out for one of the valuable 4 new plastic £5 notes onto which Artist and Engraver Graham Short added a tiny portrait of Jane, together with a short quote from her works.

Later this year, look out for her life-sized statue outside the Willis and the artists' trail of book benches around the town.

The 6th Basingstoke Festival (June to July), theme 'Born in the Borough', will celebrate 'local talent' including Jane Austen. http://

Theft

Burglary Prevention Tips

Taking just a few steps can make a big difference in keeping your home safe from burglary. Here are a few tips:

- * Lock your doors and windows every time you leave the house, even when you're out in the garden, remembering to double-lock UPVC doors (lift handle and turn key)
- * Hide all keys, including car keys, out of sight and away from the letterbox (remember a device could be used to hook keys through the letterbox)
- * Install good outside lighting
- * Get a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property
- * Leave radios or lights in your house on a timer to make the property appear occupied
- * Make sure the fences around your garden are in good condition
- * Secure bikes at home by locking them to an immoveable object inside a locked shed or garage
- * Keep ladders and tools stored away; locked if possible - don't leave them outside where they could be used to break into your home
- * Ensure side gates are locked to prevent access to the rear of the property
- * Ensure rear fencing is in good repair
- * Improve natural surveillance at the front of your property, i.e. trim high hedges
- Mark your property with postcode and house number and register your property free with Immobilise
- * Consider joining or forming a Neighbourhood Watch scheme
- * Remove valuables from view of ground floor windows
- * Much vehicle crime is preventable. It can take as little as 10 seconds for a thief to steal something from your car. The best way to protect your belongings is to lock your car whenever you leave it and check it is locked. Other things include:
- * Removing everything from the car; don't even leave a jacket where it can be seen
- * Closing the sunroof along with the windows when you leave
- * Not storing things in the boot; take them with you
- * Storing car ownership information in your home, not your car
- * Having a routine to ensure you always take the keys out of the ignition
- * Taking removable stereos and sat nav equipment with you
- * In addition, using secure (theft resistant) number plates can make your plates less attractive to thieves
