Bygones

Alexandra Road Organised crime
My mother Ellen Phoebe Partridge
(White) was born in Basingstoke in
1912. She left school in 1926 to
become a Burberry girl apprentice
seamstress. In 1933 the great
depression was biting and she was
laid off



After several w e e k s unemployment she answered a knock at the door. Stood in front of her was her former supervisor from Burberry, who offered her a part time job.

Also laid off, the supervisor had copied the patterns of Burberry's most popular men's and women's raincoats and was setting up in business to produce *fake* Burberry raincoats. Given her family of eight's economic circumstances my mother accepted the offer of employment.

If you walk down Alexandra Road from Worting Road on the left-hand path about a third of the way down you will see an archway set into the terraced houses. Walk under the archway towards the end of the back gardens, on the right-hand side there is a large brick and slate tiled shed which stretches laterally across the back of 3 gardens. It was in that shed my mother, her former supervisor at Burberry and, her friend Kitty Earle (another Burberry trained seamstress from May Street) made fake Burberry raincoats for 18 months. The raincoats sold to department stores in Bournemouth and Birmingham.

When the economy picked up, my mother found employment on the production line with Eli Lily. Kitty Earle became a house wife and cleaned the Methodist chapel in May Street, as well as being a bookies runner for Bert Bone, father of Gary Bone, who on the 7th of September showed the film about the history of Thornycroft in the village hall. The shed is now owned by a local heritage builder.
