Bygones

Alton Light Railway Part II

Take a walk near Basingstoke Waterworks, opposite the cottages off Churchill Way, you will find the remaining structures from the historic Alton Light Railway dating from about 1901. These include track, sleepers and a buffer, now included in the Basingstoke List of Buildings of Local Historic or Architectural Interest.

This line, the first to be approved under the Light Railway Act of 1896, ran until WW1, when the tracks were removed and used in France. The line was re-laid after the war but lost out to regular buses and closed in 1928. A spur from the railway served the Thornycroft factory and another spur ran into Park Prewett Asylum.



This spur built to carry building materials for the new Knowle Asylum "relief hospital". served Prewett for almost 40 years".

The local firm of Mussellwhite and Sapp built this spur which included a tight curve just after the Kingsclere Road (which caused the train to get stuck), a 1:53 hill with an extended platform at Prewett (in 1917 for Canadian Army WW1 "non-stretchered" soldiers?).

After Prewett was completed in 1916, the line transported twice weekly boiler coal to the asylum.



Basingstoke Horizon 2050

A rich past, a bold vision, a bright future!

The Council Leader's (Cllr Sander) 30 year vision (reported as an anticipated doubled Borough population by 2050) recently consulted and shaped with ipsos MORI online responses, 20 events, workshops, 1,101 interviews with nearly 1500 residents and partners in 1400 conversation hours developing these 8 evidence based themes below:



This document recently passed into policy & to the Local Strategic Partnership (BASP).

The Council has significant challenges in funding, home building, managing autonomous vehicles for both personal use and end of high street deliveries, safe cycling and walking, sustainable energy, climate change and quality of life.

In looking forward to big project and big event aspirations to overcome more of the same mediocrity, the desires were captured for a higher education facility, retaining a major hospital, continuing attractive place to live and improved shopping centre.

No mention of the new football stadium, canal, increasing headline events to attract visitors and tourists, or mitigating services interacted by computer artificial intelligence alone without any human moderation.

This document does include the ambitions of infrastructure, sports, leisure and community, importance of nature, carbon footprint reduction, generating energy and consuming waste, new transport technology and improved infrastructure, university level education maintaining jobs and creating careers, encouraging and supporting new business, recognising and embracing history and culture and ensuring the town hub continues.

It remains to be seen how all this will get funded (£Bns?) and delivered!
