#### Patient Participation Group (PPG) for Camrose, Gillies & Hackwood (CGH)

- Do you belong to the CGH Doctor's Surgery?

We suspect many of you do not know what that three-letter acronym stands for, so we'd like to introduce ourselves!

We are a group of 18 volunteer patients and carers who meet formally every two months with practice representatives from the Camrose, Gillies and Hackwood Partnership.

We discuss and share information and feedback in a very constructive and collaborative two-way dialogue.

Our primary purpose is:

- To be a representative voice of patients in raising relevant issues to the practice.
- To contribute towards continual improvement in the services provided by the practice.

We also meet informally once a month, currently via Zoom.

We share anonymous feedback and conversations we have had from patients, discuss what is working well, what needs to be improved and agree strategy and what items should be put on the agenda for the next formal meeting with the practice.

It is unacceptable that foreign owners can buy up UK M3 J7 land & construct buildings on crop land & destroy biodiversity without mitigating warming during this climate emergency.

#### **Festival Place**

Hemmingway Design recently consulted on ideas for Festival Place to "bounce back better".

With retail units less likely to be fully occupied, we should guard against automatically turning them all into flats without any Building Control approvals.

Many good ideas were received which we hope are under active consideration. In addition to attracting "high-end" retail into Festival Place, there should be frequent retail promotional activities to attract customers and keep their children occupied. In addition to the usual "pop-up" opportunities created by the latest departures of Jessops & Debenhams, "retail mix profiling" should be identified to pull in "desirable" retailers to broaden "the sales offer".

"Peripheral activities" to increase footfall, include rejoining the canal towards Festival Place and big scale leisure events around town to pull in the crowds by resurrecting Balloons Over Basingstoke, Music in the Park, annual ring road electric cart race, Eastrop inland beach, permanent funfair & "eye".

#### Top of Town

Join and help the **Friends of the Top of the Town** by requesting a feedback form from Kishor at Suriya's or Olly at Willows.

Meetings are in progress with the Council to address the lack of wardens, get empty retail units occupied, increase the "retail offer" by holding monthly themed markets to promote differing product groupings and arts and cultural events and festivals from around the world, and set up a permanent indoor market in the old Heart Foundation furniture showroom in Winchester Street or the previous Post Office building in London Street.

Close attention must be paid to presenting the Top of Town as clean, tidy and welcoming, without being pestered by the homeless.


