BCA 2001 AGM Report

The Annual General Meeting of the Brookvale Community Association was held at the Village Hall on Thursday 24th May 2001. Councillors, Street Representatives and residents attended along with Ruth Buckingham, Win Nash and Margaret Aubrey, stalwarts who have held the BCA together since its formation.

Pam Mansfield welcomed everyone present and announced that she would be standing down from her position as chairperson. The minutes from the EGMs held on 16th June and 30th June 2000 were read, agreed and signed. Pam then gave her report on BCA matters. Since the hall was opened 6 months ago, events such as the Quiz Nights, Beetle Drive and Sponsored Weight Loss have taken place successfully. Groups, such as the Parents and Toddlers Group on a Wednesday, Ladies Night every second Tuesday in the month and the 3C's Coffee Mornings every other Saturday had been set up.

Pam referred to the ongoing battle of the flooding of the Victory Roundabout subway and said that since October the BCA were in consultation with Roger Archer-Reeves from the Council. He would be attending the Management' Committee Meeting in July and hopefully progress would be made in this problem's resolution.

Regarding the planning application for 47 Queens Road, Pam said the BCA had opposed its demolition and that it was now being converted into three houses, which must conform to them being in a Conservation

area. The council also agreed to meet with the BCA and concerned Mums over the renovation of King George the Fifth playground (report follows in this issue).

Jill Lucas and her husband stood down as promoters of the Lottery. Pam thanked them for all their hard work over the years and said she would be taking over. We have 90 members at present and need 100 for the Lottery to break even.

Maggie Dee then gave her treasurer's report. She said that it was encouraging to see that, despite the Hall being open only 6 months, the events takings were almost as high as for the whole of the previous year and thanked the hard work and enthusiasm of members. The

greatest expense has obviously been the rebuilding of the hall, amounting to £57,162.00. The insurance costs have increased, reflecting the risk factor already experienced and the fact that we were previously underinsured. Though at one point she thought the BCA would end the year with a £2,000 deficit, that has been turned around and Maggie was happy to report outstanding bills had been paid and there is a bank balance of £301.00.

The committee resigned and a new committee elected. Maggie Dee was elected as Treasurer, Diane Anderson as Secretary, Linda Chandler as Hall Booking Agent and the Hall/Communications Teams agreed to stay on. Other former committee members agreed to continue. It was agreed to elect a chairperson at the next committee meeting on 20th June and anyone wishing to help was welcome to attend. Those who attended enjoyed cheese and wine afterwards.

Since that meeting, Pam Banks has been elected BCA Chair for the coming year. We wish her luck in her new position and would like to thank her for her continued support.

Play areas

Various residents joined Stephen Bryer (Community Services, BDBC) on 25th June to discuss the council's plans to remove dangerous equipment and surfaces in the town's play areas. 188 play areas have been identified as 'not up to standard'. All of the high risk areas were removed or dealt with last year and a programme follows this year that will see to the medium risk areas.

Included in with those medium risk areas is the play area in King George V Playing Fields. The remaining swings and hard surfaces will be removed in August/September of this year. There are currently no plans to replace any of the equipment that will be removed - the council have made an initial estimate of £75-85,000 to provide a new area. However, due to local developers having to provide £32,000 for local facilities in the Brookvale area, there is the possibility of them providing a 'part facility'.

Those present stressed the need to site the new area away from the underpass and nearer to the houses. Mr Bryer said that the council

were open minded about the siting of the area, but that they had to consider the positioning of the sub-surface power lines that run diagonally across the field from Lower Brook Street to the far corner of the old Thorneycroft factory. It was also suggested that we consult with the residents living opposite KGV-PF and found out their opinions on the proposed re-siting. It was decided that a further meeting with Mr Bryer will take place in August.

The amount of graffiti present throughout the Brookvale area has increased in the past few weeks. The most recent attack was on the Village Hall.

If you are responsible for this vandalism, be aware that the BCA is keeping a photographic record of all incidents, particularly attacks on our own property, and we will be liasing with Hampshire Constabulary and follow through to prosecution should this continue.

If residents can keep an eye out for these incidents when they are in progress, we would be extremely grateful. Do not apprehend anyone, but if you can collect evidence on camera or video you will be helping enormously.

We'd like to thank Meg, Elaine and Kat for two very interesting evenings.


