Patient Participation Group (PPG) for Camrose, Gillies & Hackwood (CGH)

CGH continue with their recruitment programme. Problems continue with the volume of calls causing long waiting times. Efforts are being made to recruit and train more reception staff to improve efficiency.

CGH have put in place a Mental Health team, and encourage patients to contact the surgery for appointments and to make full use of the services available. There is now a Complaints Procedure in place, which can be accessed at:

-> PPG on any issues you would like to raise with the surgery, with whom we have formal meetings every two months. This does not include medical issues, which should be raised direct with the surgery.

On 30th March, and 5th April, the PPG will be holding open meetings, including tea/coffee and cake, where you can meet the PPG. These meetings will enable us to take a temperature reading of patient feeling, and hot topics. We can then take this information back to CGH, practice managers, and Operose Health, and work with them to improve things.

Crime

The Police and Crime Commissioner secured £275,179 from the Government's Safer Streets Fund in addition to 20% matched funding. This money will be used to invest in crime prevention measures within the Riverdene Estate and Festival Place area in the Eastrop & Grove ward (and part of the Brookvale and Kings Furlong ward).

The Safer Streets Fund will fund a range of proposals that will contribute to Basingstoke being a safer place to live, work and visit. The project has a challenging completion target date of 31 March 2022. Work has been underway with a range of local partners to develop detailed plans and work is proposed to take place in the following key locations currently experiencing high rates of crime:

Goat Lane, Riverdene Estate, Joices Yard, Glebe Gardens, Festival Place, Central Car Park. CCTV is being provided/ upgraded in Eastrop Car Park, Alencon Link, Church Street, Central Car Park, Glebe Gardens; Joices, Castons and Feathers Yards.

Charity News

Who We Are:

London Hearts is the leading UK charity dealing with procurement and supply of life saving defibrillators throughout the country.



Our Vision: It's difficult to determine an exact figure, but there are over 30,000 out of hospital cardiac arrests every year in the UK. Survival rates are extremely poor at around 6%, but with timely CPR and defibrillation, this can increase to up to 74%.

By placing more public access defibrillators not just throughout London, but the entire UK, and by training more people in how to use them, we hope to create a future where fewer people die of a cardiac arrest.

Our Mission: Accessibility to a defibrillator is key to saving a life when someone has a cardiac arrest, and every second is vital. That's why it's our mission to ensure that nobody is further than 100 metres from a fully functioning public access defibrillator wherever you are in the UK.

In order to fulfil this mission, we need to continually raise funds for the purchase of life saving defibrillators. Together, we can do this and save more lives.

The Statistics: There are over 30,000 out of hospital cardiac arrests every year in the UK.

Survival rates are extremely poor at around 6%, but with timely CPR and defibrillation, this can increase to up-to 74%.

When someone is having a cardiac arrest, the chances of survival decreases by 10% for every minute that goes by without CPR and defibrillation. Brain tissue starts to die after 3-4 minutes.

95% of cardiac arrest patients will die if they don't receive immediate treatment.
